The Chatham Kent Community Foundation builds endowments and other funds to provide lasting support for local priorities. The income earned by the Foundation's invested permanent funds is used to give grants to a wide range of community groups, while the original investment is retained and grows over time.

Donors have chosen to work with the Chatham Kent Community Foundation because of the flexibility it affords them. Donors can support any number of registered local charities by giving to the Foundation. Their contribution responds to needs in the community that are current and relevant.

A donation to the Chatham Kent Community Foundation is a fiscally responsible investment. The Foundation is able to minimize costs by pooling funds for investment and administration costs. As well, Foundation volunteers take care of administrative and grant-making decisions, thereby saving the donor both time and money.

The strength of the Foundation lies with its volunteers. The Board is made up of 11 dedicated Directors and many more Directors at Large who contribute significantly on Foundation committees. These volunteers also reflect the diversity of Chatham Kent, which is truly a “Community of Communities.”

# CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Once again, The Chatham Kent Community Foundation has had a successful year due to its generous donors and dedicated volunteers. The goal of the Foundation is to grant funds to charitable organizations in Chatham Kent, and to improve the quality of life for the citizens, present and future, of our community.

The Foundation provides an easy and flexible mechanism to receive donations for general or specific charitable purposes. The donated capital funds are prudently invested, and the income of these investments is used for deserving community projects.

Donations received over the course of the year totaled over \$690,000, which was added to our Endowment Fund. In 2018, there were grants totaling \$ 450,000 received by 37 charitable organizations.

The Endowment Fund has grown to \$7.9 million as a result of numerous donations. In particular, we are grateful for the support of the late Garnet George Case, who, through his estate, left \$330,000.00 to the Foundation. I would also like to thank South Kent Wind for its continued contribution to the South Kent Wind Community Fund, and Dave and Brenda Baute, who continue to support the Foundation in a most generous way.

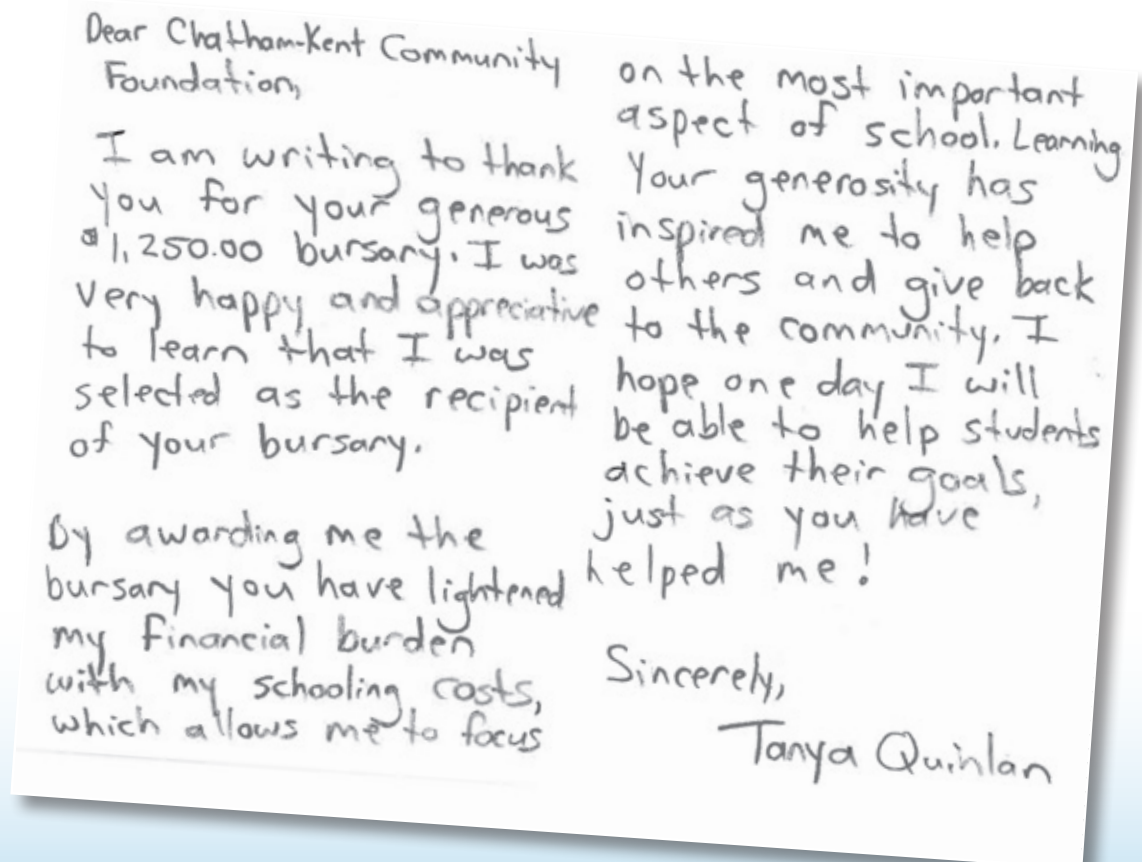

# SUPPORTING CARING COMMUNITIES

Farm neighbours look out for each other, and that's how the late Garnet Case will be remembered.

Mr. Case passed away in 2015 at the age of 87. On the advice of his lawyer he left a substantial donation to the Chatham Kent Community Foundation, a gift that will have a significant impact on how the foundation can respond to needs within his community.

Mr. Case lived on his family's farm in the former Zone Township. His neighbour and friend, Don Havens, said Mr. Case was a quiet man who enjoyed working in the bush that was on his land.

"He was a good neighbour, but he was very independent," Mr. Havens said.

Through his estate Mr. Case left a donation of \$330,000 to the CKCF, which has been used to establish the Garnet George Case Fund.

Proceeds from the fund will benefit the residents of the geographic area of the former townships of Zone and Camden, and the village of Thamesville. It will support projects that promote recreation, parks, athletics and playgrounds, as well as the activities of local charitable organizations.

Additionally, a bursary has been established to support students under the age of 30 who are enrolled in a program of post-secondary education or a program of vocational training or apprenticeship training.

Foundation Chairman Ed Little said the investment committee of the CKCF will let the fund grow for a year, and then groups in the designated community will be invited to apply for grants.

"There are definite needs in that area," Mr. Little said.

"And hopefully through this fund we can raise the profile of the foundation in that area."

Mr. Case learned of the work of the foundation through his lawyer, Tom Chalmers. When he was putting his will together, Mr. Case considered leaving a gift to a national charitable organization. Mr. Chalmers suggested the Chatham Kent Community Foundation as a way to keep the funds local.

"I have known about the foundation for years," Mr. Chalmers said.

"I suggested Mr. Case do something significant for the local community."

Mr. Chalmers said he was made aware of the work of the foundation many years ago through its founder, John Bradley, and former director Neil Wood. He said the appeal of the foundation is that when leaving a gift in an estate, the parameters can be made wide enough that a range of organizations and/or individuals can benefit from the funds.

"We made it (the Case fund) broad enough so that someone could grab onto it," Mr. Chalmers said.

It's this 'broad reach', the ability to respond to the needs of a spectrum of groups, that local agricultural entrepreneur Dave Baute says is so special about the foundation. Mr. Baute and his wife Brenda established a named fund within the Community Endowment Fund in 2015, and contributed significantly to it again in 2018.

For them, the appeal is that the Foundation reaches across all borders within Chatham Kent.

"The Foundation helps the rural community for sure, but the money goes all across the municipality.

"The disbursements go far afield."

And the grants that are passed on are not all large sums of money. They do, however, help where help is needed.

"The grants help make communities a little friendlier," Mr. Baute said. "They help bring communities together."

Mr. Baute said the work of the Foundation is important in supporting local groups and individuals, but also in allowing people to offer help. He hopes through supporting the Foundation, he can encourage others to do the same.

"There's so much disparity any more, and it's getting worse," Mr. Baute said.

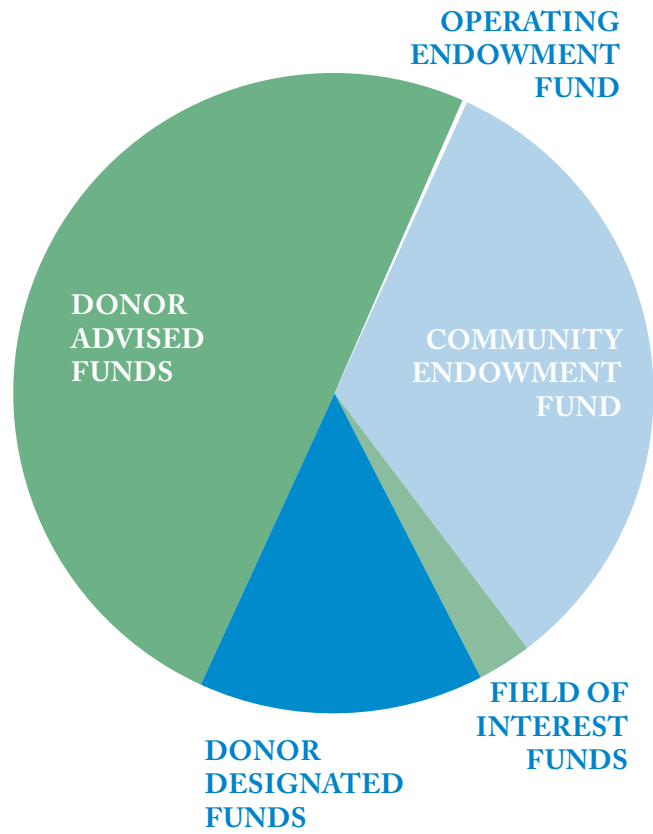
"If we don't step up, it doesn't bode well for a bright future for any of us."

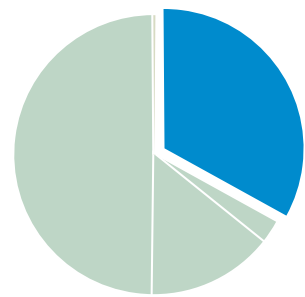
# ABOUT OUR FUNDS

The Chatham Kent Community Foundation has five types of funds. The first fund, namely the COMMUNITY ENDOWMENT FUND, is a general type of fund that leaves control over the granting of investment income to the discretion of the Foundation Board. The remaining four types of funds, specifically the FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS, DESIGNATED FUNDS, DONOR ADVISED FUNDS and the OPERATING ENDOWMENT FUND, differ from the Community Endowment Fund essentially in the way they direct how the investment income is granted.



## 1. Community Endowment Fund

These discretionary funds offer the greatest amount of flexibility to the Foundation in responding to the immediate and changing needs of the community. Donors do not place restrictions on the use of the funds and rely on the Board of Directors to make grant decisions that meet current community priorities and needs. The Community Endowment Fund has within it the opportunity to have Funds “Named” in the name of the donor or some other honoree.



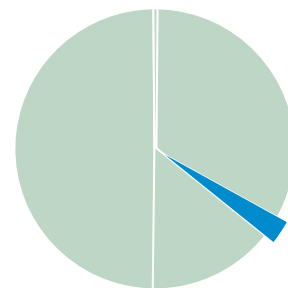

## 2. Field of Interest Funds

These funds work much like the Community Endowment Fund except that the donors will identify an area of interest that they would like to support. The donor empowers the Foundation's Board to select worthwhile projects to support. Named Funds are also possible. The Chatham Kent Community Foundation has three Field of Interest Funds currently available to our donors:



### Wayne & Sylvia Barnard Family Fund

Established in 2017 by Wayne and Sylvia Barnard, the Wayne and Sylvia Barnard Family Fund was created to provide grants to support Chatham-Kent organizations that provide services or programs to Chatham-Kent residents under the age of 19 years. The services or programs may be recreational, educational, artistic, therapeutic, medical, cultural, social or environmental in nature.

### Ontario Endowment for Children & Youth in Recreation in Chatham-Kent

This Fund was established through a matching grant from the Ministry of Citizenship, Culture and Recreation, of the Province of Ontario. ### The Environmental Legacy Fund

This Fund was established through a partnership with the J.W. McConnell Foundation of Montreal. 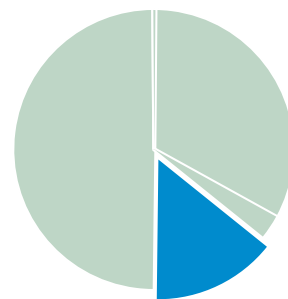

### 3. Donor Designated Funds

If a specified charity ceases to exist and the donor has not named a successor beneficiary, and the donor is unavailable to advise the Foundation, the Foundation will redirect the funds to a Named Fund within the Community Fund.

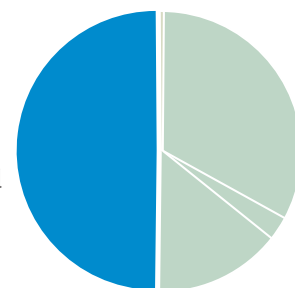

Provisions should be made in the Donor Advised Fund Agreement to provide directions to the Foundation in the event of the death of the donor or designated advisor.

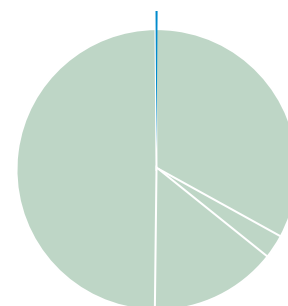

# GRANT MAKING

## **Timeline:**

The Chatham Kent Community Foundation follows a Grant Review Process. The Grant Committee reviews all requests twice per year and makes grants in June and November. In this way, it is hoped that the Foundation can be responsive to the needs of charitable organizations within the community.

## **Guidelines:**

The Board of Directors has developed the following application guidelines:

1. The Foundation supports charitable organizations concerned with EDUCATION, HEALTH, ARTS and CULTURE, RECREATION, the ENVIRONMENT, HERITAGE, and SOCIAL SERVICES that operate for the citizens of Chatham-Kent.
2. Grants are made only to REGISTERED CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. Organizations seeking funds must demonstrate a strong, committed Board, fiscal responsibility and management qualifications.
3. Grants are awarded for DEFINITE PURPOSES, and for projects covering a specified period of time. Multi-year grants are subject to periodic performance reviews.
4. Preference is given to projects which:
  - (a) encourage more efficient use of community resources
  - (b) expect to test or demonstrate new approaches and techniques in the solution of community problems
  - (c) are developed in consultation with other agencies and planning groups, and those which promote coordination, co-operation and sharing among organizations, and the elimination of duplicated services
  - (d) promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement in the community
  - (e) expect to strengthen internal management capabilities of agencies.
5. CAPITAL PROJECTS will be considered if there is a demonstrated need.
6. BURSARIES and SCHOLARSHIPS are usually awarded to educational institutions and not to individuals.
7. Grants are not usually made to support OPERATING EXPENSES of established organizations or programs.
8. Grants are not made to establish or add to ENDOWMENT FUNDS.
9. Grants are not usually made to RELIGIOUS or POLITICAL organizations for direct activities.
